What is the process of obtaining a license/permit if under the age of 18?



Missouri's Graduated Driver License law (GDL) requires that all first-time drivers between 15 and 18 years old complete a period of driving with a licensed driver (instruction permit), and restricted driving (intermediate license), before getting a full driver license.



What are the different types of licenses in the Graduated Driver License Law (GDL) program?



- Instructional Permit eligible at the of 15
- Intermediate License (Class F) eligible at the of 16
- Full Driver's License (Class F) eligible at the of 18



What information does the DMV require prior to taking driver examinations and getting the Driver's License?





Anyone obtaining a new license or permit is required to show verification of name, date of birth, place of birth, social security number, and Missouri residential address.



Who administers the written and driver examination?



The Driver Examination Division or/and The Missouri State Highway Patrol Division administers the written and driving examinations to qualifying individuals.



What are all the services Keys to Independence can cover?



The program covers these driving services:

- Learner's license fee (Instruction permit and Intermediate License)
- Driver's license fee
- Testing fees (knowledge or skill re-tests)
- Car for Road Test (Provided by the driving school)



Can enrolled youth and their caregivers receive reimbursement for costs associated with obtaining a driver's license?





Yes, reimbursable expenses may include:

- Instructions Permit
- Intermediate license fee
- Driver's license fee
- DMV processing fee
- Car fee for road test

The program covers all regions of Missouri.



What does the program not cover?



The program does not cover for outstanding tickets, citations, tags, title fees, and auto insurance.
